Featured Artist of the Month

SGA Chairman Martin Webster

Every painting is a voyage into a sacred harbour" – Giotto di Bondone

I have reached that age when you spend quite a bit of time reviewing what went on in the past, not least in your own life. So being asked to do the "Artist of the Month' has given me opportunity to actually write down some of the thoughts and conclusions I have, particularly in respect to Art – but its probably true that this applies to all of my life.



It wasn't until my early twenties that I realised that a consistent vision that kept cropping up was probably one of my earliest recollections. I am looking up at the sky and sun, through branches. I note the reflections and shadows that fall on my vision, there is a wonderful sense in me of well being, being truly alive and also a closeness to God.

It was my mum who pointed out to me that when very young she would put me in the pram and push me to the end of the garden (we had one of those long but thin urban gardens with lots of fruit trees in). There I would stay for hours perfectly content!

I guess if I leap forward to now, my painting now is always about trying to capture some aspect of these earliest visions. This gives me great joy and thankfulness.

I now also recognise that from this earliest point and through all that followed my great interest and strength has been in seeing patterns in all things.



Early on, I loved Maths and Physics (English was my struggle point) ending up studying Physics for my degree at Nottingham. Although I thought about following this area for future work I also felt a call to work with people and communities, which led to Ordination in the Church of England.

At this time, I wasn't doing any art at all but I guess I was pouring my creative bent into creating authentic and uplifting worship, and helping people to realise their potential as a human being.


In the mid 80's I was appointed to a parish called Nazeing, on the western edge of Essex. A very standard sized semi-rural commuter village. In the congregation were two full time artists as well as a number of art teachers and part time artists. All of these started to work on me to try painting.


I am especially grateful to Muriel Thurgood, who took me under her wing. She showed me how to use four colours of oils, a small brush and kitchen paper on a small piece of melamine The first picture I did blew me away and I was hooked! It was only a 3x4 inch size but it meant it kept the variables to a minimum and you could always wipe it out and start again.

Since then of course I have expanded and tried different mediums, till alighting upon Acrylic on Canvas. When I was working, I only had a short time to paint, and so acrylic was by far the easiest to pick up and put down. With acrylic nowadays you can do everything that oils can do.

Since retiring some six years ago, I have made it an ambition to try and become the best painter I can be. Although I feel I have made great progress, I am not there yet!

Along the way, my wife Vicky and our family have been a huge encouragement to me as well as the marvellous Salisbury Group of Artists. You will see from the accompanying photos, that landscapes and seascapes along with the odd still life are my bread and butter painting. Nonetheless, every time I pick up


